

UPDATED TRAVEL ADVISORY: MOZAMBIQUE

Wednesday, 30 October 2024

Mozambique's opposition leaders have called for week-long protest action, including public demonstrations and a national strike, from **Thursday, 31 October 2024**. This follows recent election-related unrest that has already impacted border operations.

The situation remains volatile, and travellers can expect:

- Intermittent closures and delays at the Lebombo/Ressano Garcia Border Post
- Disruption to normal business operations
- Mass mobilisation and protest action in the country's capital, Maputo
- A nationwide strike affecting services
- Potential security force involvement

Please advise your clients to:

- 1. Defer non-essential travel to Mozambique during this period.
- 2. Avoid the Lebombo Border Post if possible and monitor the situation at other border posts.
- 3. Exercise increased caution if travel is necessary.
- 4. Monitor local news and official communications.
- 5. Have contingency plans in place.

Where possible, please reach out to local suppliers and operators in Mozambique to explore postponement and rebooking options.
